



### What is the Neighbor **HELPING** Neighbor Evacuate Program?

*This program is designed for the community to take care of one another during a tsunami evacuation.*

1. To identify persons in our community who need help getting "up the hill" during tsunami evacuation.
2. Assigning a responsible "Buddy" within a four block radius to drive their neighbor, who needs assistance, "up the hill."
3. To issue window placards to those in need of assistance.
4. To issue rear view mirror placards to drivers who are able to drive indicating to emergency personnel that you are a "buddy" allowing them to proceed "up the hill."

### How Can I Be **PREPARED** For A Tsunami?

*We cannot assume that emergency personnel will be available to help us.*

*We NEED to take care of one another.*

### **LOCAL** Tsunami

An undersea earthquake near the Oregon Coast. You will feel the earthquake. The Tsunami could come onshore within 15 to 20 minutes after the earthquake. Evacuate immediately! Do not wait for an official warning.

### **DISTANT** Tsunami

An undersea earthquake far away from the coast. You will not feel an earthquake. The Tsunami could take 4 or more hours to reach shore.

Typical wave heights from Tsunamis occurring in the Pacific Ocean, over the last 80 years, have been 20-45 feet at the shoreline. However, because of local conditions a few waves have been much higher...as much as 100 feet or more.

Residents living West of Highway 101 will have to evacuate "up the hill." The safe zone is at 60 feet elevation. Remember, you will need to evacuate "up the hill."

### How To Assemble A **SURVIVAL** Kit for 4 Days!

1. First Aid Kit and reference guide.
2. Water - 1 gallon per person per day: for drinking, hygiene and cooking.
3. Food (packaged, canned, no-cook, as well as baby food and food for special diets.
4. Can opener (non-electric).
5. Blankets or sleeping bags.
6. Fire extinguisher (standard).
7. Essential medications.
8. Money
9. Food and water for pets. Pet leashes.
10. Portable radio, NOAA weather radio, flashlights and batteries.
11. Alternate cooking source and matches.
12. Crescent wrench for utility shut-off (1/2" or longer).

Our local fire department has information about purchasing various types of packs. For instance: classrooms, families, singles, or someone who can not carry heavy objects.
